



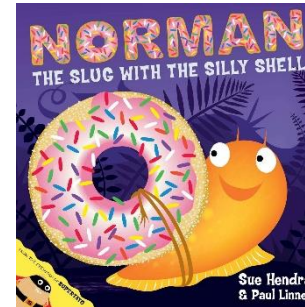

Our featured text this week was “Norman, The Slug with a Silly Shell”.

We talked about different patterns that we could see in snail shells and learned lots of amazing new vocabulary. Now we know that snails have tentacles and their body is called a foot!

This week we have been scientists. We looked at our class snails with scientists’ eyes and talked about the things that we could see, hear and feel. We noticed the spiral shape of the shell and we noticed that the snails felt wet, cold and slimy on our skin. We took this learning into the playdough area and used our fine motor skills to model playdough. Our favourite part of this week was hunting for snails in our outdoor area. We know that snails prefer wet weather so it was tricky to find them.



We used water colour paints this week to create new shell designs for Norman. It was tricky to take our paintbrush for a walk at first but we persevered!
