CLASS NEWS

We visit Cannon Hall Farm!

Literacy: Our literacy learning this term will continue around exploring the seaside and the oceans. Key vocabulary: *sea, ocean, jellyfish, octopus, coral, mermaid, seahorse, dolphin, seaweed, diver, fish, reeds.* Sound discrimination: *splashing sounds, water gugging, bubbling, various sea sounds.* Cat invites listeners to join us on our imaginary journey diving 'Under the sea.' Children are prompted to imagine diving down, down under the sea. We will encourage them to close their eyes and imagine what they might see: *jellyfish, octopus, coral, lots of fish* and then listen to the song and join in with the words if known. We will also have a visit from the ice cream man!

In Year 5, we will ensure that we teach the Year 5 spelling lists as well as embed spelling rules previously taught. **Maths:** Our maths learning journey this half term will guide use through the world of number to 20 and beyond, odd and even numbers.

PSHE: All about me – naming the body parts
